In service to our country, Kampong Province Cambodia. On December 19, 1st Lt. Peter C. Forame's two man observation helicopter went down in eastern Cambodia under hostile fire. On Tuesday the lieutenant's official status was changed from missing to killed in action. His father, retired Army Col. Peter R. Forame of McLean, VA, was told the helicopter had exploded on impact. Recovery of the body was prohibited by enemy fire and then B52 bomber strikes where the aircraft fell. Lt. Forame, 24, grew up in Northern Virginia and was a 1969 graduate of George Mason College where he was president of the student council. After college he entered Officer Candidate School and graduated at the

head of his class at Ft. Sill, OK, artillery school. At Ft. Rucker, AL, he was trained to fly helicopters. He left for Vietnam September, 1970 to join the 101st Airborne Division. Lt. Forame had been assigned to the sector of the demilitarized zone until the last of the unit was returned to the US in December. He was transferred to the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment and was hit when flying his first support mission with the helicopter unit near the Parrot's Beak of Cambodia. In a letter dated Dec 1, Lt. Forame told his family he had decided to leave the Army at the end of his present term. He wrote that he wanted to come home to work on environmental problems, perhaps as a forester or naturalist. An avid fisherman and scuba diver, he was "very ecology-minded", his father said. It may not pay too well, he wrote, but I think I've made the right choice and perhaps I can help preserve some of our country's natural beauty before it's totally destroyed. Besides his Father, he leaves his Mother, Grandmother, and a sister. A Memorial mass will be said at 10:00 AM on March 18 at the Ft. Myer Chapel. Peter's gravesite is in the Honolulu Memorial Cemetery, Honolulu, HI.

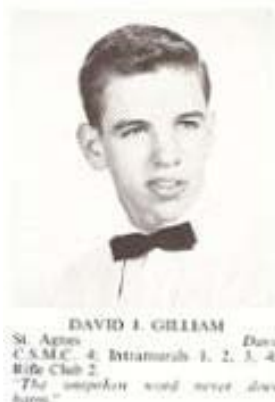

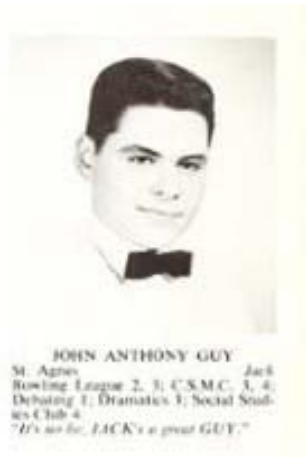
Barbara (Grubb) Curtis



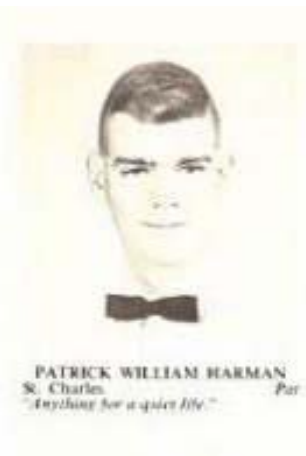
This week we were deeply saddened to learn of the passing of a longtime Crosswalk.com contributor. Barbara Curtis, of Purcellville, Virginia, died unexpectedly of a stroke on Tuesday, October 30, 2012. She was 64. For nearly eight years Barbara wrote compelling, God-honoring articles for Crosswalk.com. Her faith and her love of family were evident in every piece she sent us. Our archives are filled with her thoughtful wisdom and poignant insight. Barbara was the author of nine books on spiritual life, as well as the blog Mommy Life, where she wrote about the joys and challenges of raising 12 children, nine born to her, three adopted. Four of Barbara's children – including all three adopted ones – have Down

Syndrome. Barbara's husband Tripp posted details of Barbara's passing, including evidence of God's benevolent mercy in the process, at MommyLife.net. Originally from California, Curtis overcame alcoholism in 1980, was a Montessori-trained pioneer in homeschooling, and became an advocate for the pro-life cause and Down Syndrome awareness. Former Crosswalk.com editor Sarah Phillips knew Barbara well from working with her over a seven year period. Sarah had recently chatted with Barbara, who was excited about her son's engagement and her daughter's announcement of her first baby. "Barbara passionately and tirelessly brought her gifts to every sphere of life – her family, writing, friendships, the local community and even politics," Sarah told us today. "Her focus was her family life, but you don't need to look far in the blogosphere to discover the countless women, mothers and writers who considered her a friend and a mentor. She'll be dearly missed." "Barbara's writing embodied the spirit of our mission on Crosswalk.com," said Editor-in-chief Stephen McGarvey. "Our Christian faith gives us answers to every issue and problem we face on this side of eternity. Barbara's words explored this idea, but Barbara's life exemplified it." 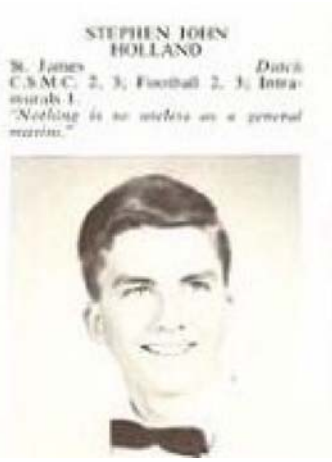

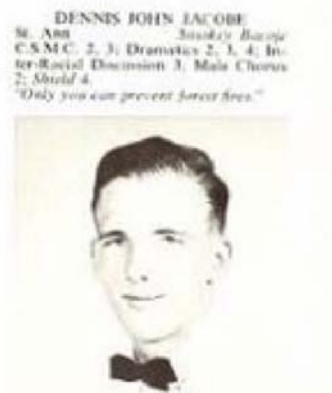

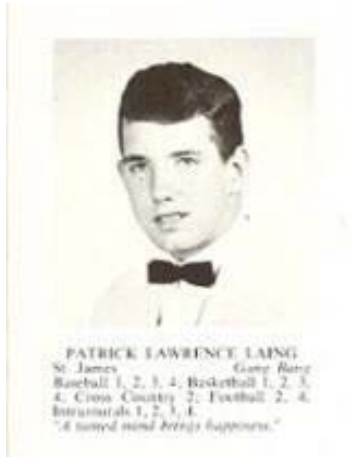

Judge, an independent researcher who tirelessly amassed and disseminated evidence supporting alternative explanations — some called them conspiracy theories — for President John F. Kennedy's assassination, the 9/11 terrorist attacks and other historic events, died April 15 at a nursing facility in the District. He was 66, after suffering a stroke. Through years of investigation and activism, Mr. Judge developed a devoted following in the community of skeptics who question official or commonly accepted narratives of the past. He co-founded and

directed the Coalition on Political Assassinations, an organization whose activities include investigating the deaths in the 1960s of John Kennedy, his brother Robert F. Kennedy, civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. and black nationalist leader Malcolm X. News outlets, with some frequency, featured Mr. Judge and his work. He turned his Washington home into a repository of thousands of volumes and documents on political assassinations and other matters, supporting himself over the decades through odd jobs and fundraising work. He was once described as a "professional conspiracist," but he considered himself an "alternate historian," according to his Web site, judgeforyourself.org. "I tell people you can call me a conspiracy theorist if you call everyone else a coincidence theorist," Mr. Judge quipped to the publication National Journal. His most noted work involved President Kennedy's death in Dallas on Nov. 22, 1963. Like legions of others doubters labeled conspiracy theorists, Mr. Judge rejected the Warren Commission's finding that Lee Harvey Oswald had been the lone gunman. Mr. Judge's working theory, he told interviewers, was that the assassination had been organized by the Joint Chiefs of Staff. "I don't think this is an insoluble parlor mystery," he once told the Dallas Morning News. "I don't think we are just flailing in the dark."

Patrick Laing



Rebels' A.D. dies at school Lawrence Patrick "Pat" Laing, the longtime director of student activities at Fairfax High School, died Saturday, March 13, at the school after going into a diabetic coma. He was 56. Frank Mustac and Tom Lawson Laing, who lived in Burke, worked for 34 years at Fairfax, beginning his tenure there in 1972 and taking over as student activities director in 1982. He also served for a number of years as the director of the AAA Northern Region baseball tournament. Steve Henry, boys head basketball coach at Flint Hill school on Jermantown Road in Fairfax, served as basketball coach for

29 years under Laing at Fairfax. "The friendship with him is what I will miss the most, Henry said. "To the Fairfax community, he meant so much. He was always doing things to make things better." "It's horrible that it had to end like this," he said. Tom Verbanic, the current head football coach at Westfield High School, worked with Laing for 17 years at Fairfax from 1983 to 2000. "We had a great relationship," Verbanic said. "We were good friends. We worked together, played together and laughed together." "It's just what you don't want to hear," he said of Laing's death. "I hope people remember all the great things he did." "First and foremost, he wanted to make sure the kids were taken care of all the time," Verbanic said. "You don't see too many [activities] directors out on the tractor getting the fields ready," he said. "If something needed to be done, he would get it done. I think that's something that is pretty special." Fairfax Principal Linda Thompson spoke highly of Laing, who died apparently while checking on the athletic facilities at the school. "For the past 22 years, he has given his entire life to Fairfax High School activities," Thompson wrote in a message posted on the Fairfax High School Web site: "I" target="_blank"><http://www.fcps.edu/FairfaxHS>. "I enjoyed talking with him about the Clemson (Thompson's alma mater) versus South Carolina (Laing's alma mater) rivalry. He played baseball for South Carolina," Thompson wrote. "Mr. Laing came to work every day, including Saturdays and Sundays, usually from 7 a.m. to

10 p.m., with no other thought than making Fairfax High School the best. No one worked harder or longer than Pat Laing. No one loved Fairfax HS more. Ultimately, he died here, at the place he loved," Thompson said. "Pat gave everything he had to the kids, Fairfax and the Northern Region. He epitomized what education was all about. He wanted to make things first class in all that he did," she said. Laing's funeral was held Wednesday morning at Fairfax Memorial Funeral Home on Braddock Road in Fairfax. He is survived by his wife, Catherine; two daughters, Kathryn and Sara; two brothers, Dennis and John; and a sister, Regina Venn. 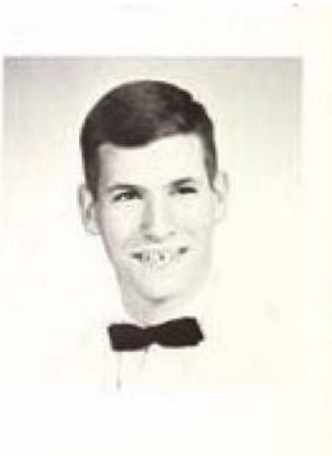

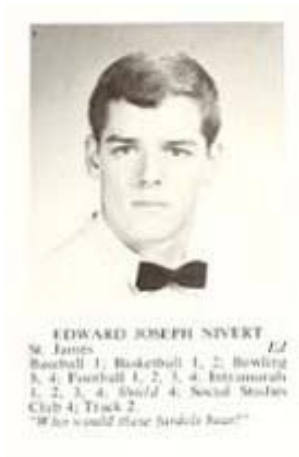

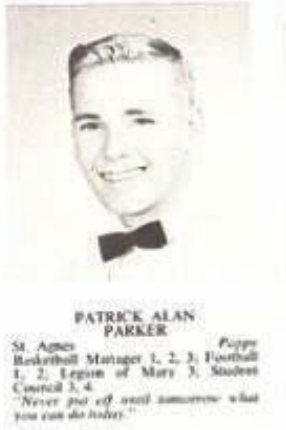

He wears his hair long, enjoys a good joke, plans to get married next month and has his career all planned. But "Willie" is different. Over 85% of his body is paralyzed. He can only use six muscles from the neck down and the doctors say there is virtually no chance he will ever move more. It happened May 14, 1968, when he was learning to ride a motorcycle at Tufts University in Medford, MA, and it "just got away from me" he said. He ended up with a broken

neck, brain damage and a fractured skull. He has been confined to a wheelchair ever since. He returned to school the next spring taking two courses to see if I could do it. Computers have now become his forte and Powell hopes to work with them after graduation. He has had to abandon civil engineering due to dexterity issues. He hopes to eventually earn enough money in computers to go into designing equipment to help other quadriplegics. He plans to marry his fiancé, Claire Hannsford, on June 21, 1969, at his parents' home in Arlington.
